

# December 2025 prayer diary

#### **MONDAY 1 DECEMBER**

- Many universities Christian Unions are hosting carol services over the coming weeks. Pray that the gospel is faithfully proclaimed and that students invite boldly.
- Pray that city workers will take the opportunity to invite colleagues to carol services and then bring them back after Christmas.
- On behalf of our Facilities Team, they ask that we pray for:
